This antique library stairs was created in France, circa 1880. The three-step ladder with supportive backrest handle at the top, stands on small front turned legs. Each step is upholstered with an inset burgundy leather further embellished with gold-embossed floral medallions motifs, and surrounded by gold tooling on the edges, adding a touch of refinement and luxury to the piece. Each step is supported by finely turned wooden legs, enhancing its structural stability and decorative appeal. The Louis Philippe style step ladder is in excellent condition commensurate with age and use, and adorns a rich walnut patina throughout. This library ladder is more than just a functional accessory; it also serves as a decorative accent, perfect for spaces with antique or classic decor. It can also double as a display stand for books, plants, or decorative items when not in use. With its elegant rouge leather detailing and warm wood tones, it would make a stylish and useful addition to any library or study. The tallest step is 27" from the ground.
