Created by Charolles earthenware, in Burgundy France circa 1870, the large hand-painted ceramic plate depicts a center medallion with two cherubs kissing. Above the cherubs, is a winged face flanked by two cranes intertwined with flowing acanthus leaves. The scalloped, flower-shaped rim is richly decorated with delicate floral and foliate motifs in blue, yellow, and green, creating a harmonious and pastoral charm. The vibrant colors and intricate detailing reflect the artistry of Charolles faïence. The ceramic plate is in excellent condition, commensurate with age and use, this decorative wall faïence would make a remarkable addition to any porcelain collection. Charolles earthenware, or Faïence de Charolles, is a type of French pottery originating in Charolles, Burgundy, since 1844. Known for its hand-painted floral motifs, soft color palette, and tin-glazed finish, Charolles faïence often features braided rope-style details, openwork, and sculptural reliefs.
